<u>Curriculum</u>

This term the children will be exploring some wonderful topics from Curriculum Maestro. We have begun the Summer Term with our topic 'Sunshine and Sunflowers', in



this topic the children will learn all about planting and growing, minibeasts and staying safe in the sun! We will be planting our own sunflowers and observing them grow and observing the metamorphosis of caterpillars into butterflies.

Our topic for Spring Term 2 is 'Big Wide World', in this topic the children will learn about life in different countries around the world, comparing this with our lives in the UK. We will learn about the continents and oceans that make up our World and the characteristics of each country.

We will also be exploring seasonal changes that occur during Spring and Summer.

Another exciting aspect of our curriculum is 'Talk 4 Writing'. Our stories for Spring Term are 'The Enormous Turnip' and 'Handa's Surprise'. We will create a story map for this story and will perform this story as a class! Please ask us to prac-

Phonics

To support your child's phonics progress links to RWI practise videos will be sent out weekly on our google classroom page. Please endeavour to watch these and practise the core phonics skills shown.

Education City Homework

Education City Homework is set every Friday, and is expected to be completed by the following Friday each week. Log ins can be found on the inside cover of your child's reading diary.

Reading Books and Reading Diaries

Your child has been given a reading diary and rocket phonics book to support reading at home. These books are changed once a week. Your child should be reading with you every day, and at least one comment should be written in diaries in order for the book to be changed. Please ensure your child's reading diary and book is in their book bag every day. Library books are changed on a fortnightly basis, please check that you have no overdue books at home as this will hinder your child receiving a new book.

<u>Lunches</u>

With the introduction of the Government incentive your child will be entitled to a free school meal each day. There is no need to book a dinner for **Reception children**. We will assume they will be having a school lunch unless they bring a lunchbox. If your child has any dietary requirements please book an appointment to see a member of our catering team through the school office. If you would have been entitled to free school meals prior to the Government incentive please ensure you have completed the relevant paperwork as this entitles your child to additional school funding.
