What happens at an election?

General elections usually take place every five years. People who are 18 and over have the chance to vote to choose their local MP. This happens at a polling station and choosing from a list of people who want to be elected. If somebody finds it difficult to get to a polling station, they can vote by post as well.







Voting

 Most MPs belong to a political party, a group of people who have similar ideas about how they want to run the UK. Before an election, they will try to persuade people to vote for them by explaining why they think their ideas are better than everyone else's.
