Homework:

- Homework is set on Education City,
 MathsWatch and/or Google Classroom each Friday and is expected to be completed by the following Friday.
- Children will receive spellings on a Thursday and have a spelling test on the following Thursday.
 These will be recorded in their spelling book and children are expected to practise daily.
- Sometimes, your child will be given a task to complete in their Literacy & Language homework book. Please ensure they complete this neatly and read the questions carefully.
- Reading—30 mins each day. This should be their reading book from school but additionally children can read their own book from home or other suitable reading material.
- Your child has been given a reading diary and reading book and these are expected to be brought to school every day.
- 'X' tables—Children should be continuously practicing their times tables, particularly 7, 8, 9 and 12s. Times Tables Rockstars is an excellent way to practise at home.

P.E

This will take place on Wednesdays (65). Please make sure that your child has the following:

 Swimming costume / trunks / tight shorts; towel; swimming hat

PE for 6G will take place on Mondays and Thursdays (netball and football). Children will need to wear full school PE kit (black shorts/joggers, white t-shirt and trainers).

For your child's health and safety, jewellery will need to be removed for these sessions.

Science:

Our topic this term is all about living things and their habitats. We will be learning about how animals and plants have adapted to their environments. It would be beneficial for children to complete independent research about this topic prior to study.

Geography:

This term, we are learning about South America, in particular, the Amazon river and rainforest.

Children are encouraged to research more about this at home, either online or in books from the local library.

History:

This term we will be studying the impact of WWI and WWII on our country and local area. Again, it would be beneficial for children to read around this area as much as possible.
