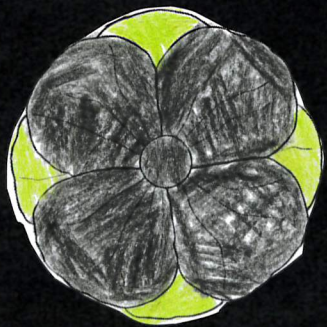
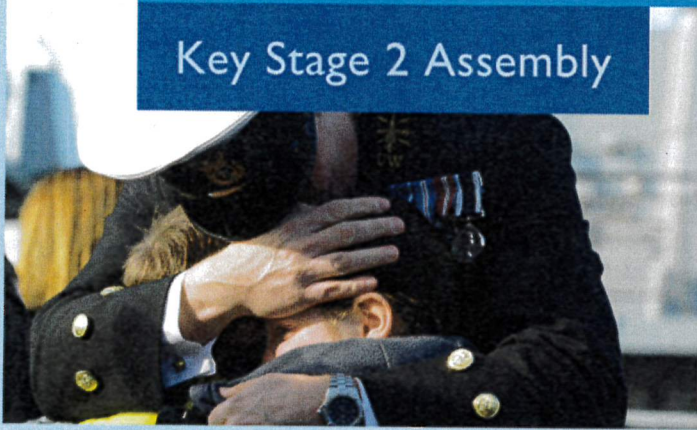

Dear God,

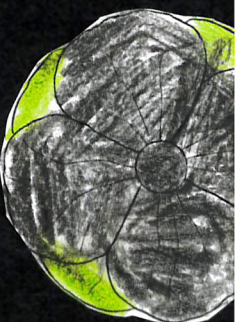
On this mournful day, we remember our brave men standing proud and tall, so smart, and so bold, yet some were so small. In uniform they bravely marched and waved as they left.

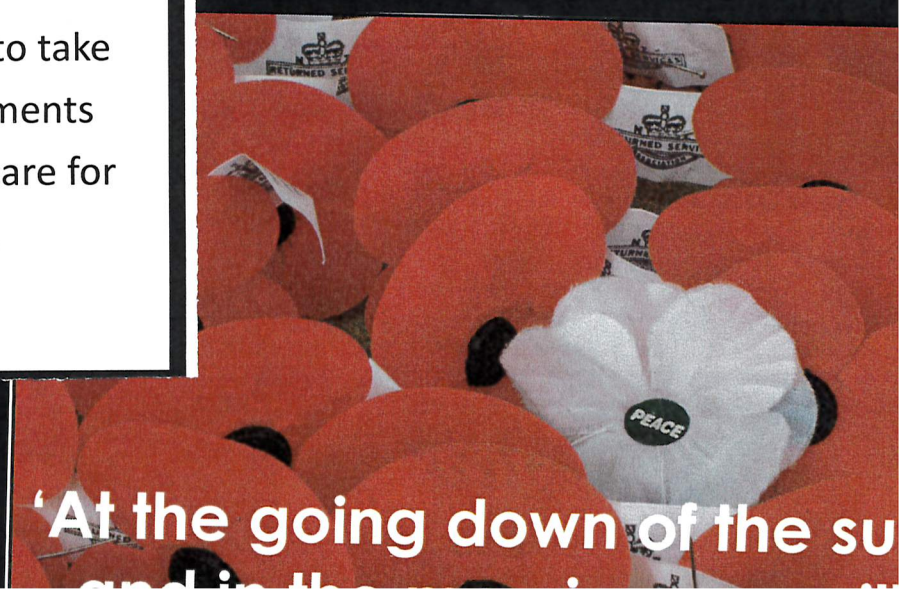

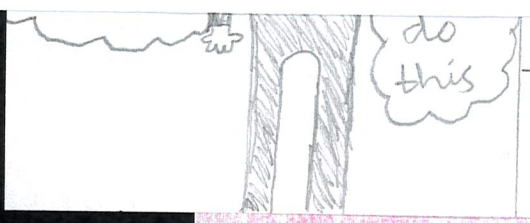

She fought for girls' education and got shot in the head for doing it.



She Malala was immediately sent to the Queen Elizabeth hospital in Birmingham and was treated well so she survived.

She grew up in a SWAT valley in Pakistan and she fought for the right for education in Taliban.

The impact of this was massive as she got girls something which is important.

She makes me feel sorry as she got shot in the head at the age of 15. Also she did it for the right of education (Article 28)

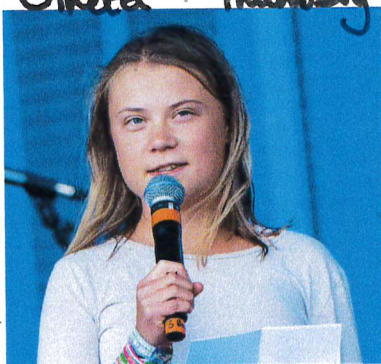
