



# Phonics screening check

## 2017 scoring guidance

### Pronunciation of real words and pseudo-words

Some of the graphemes used in the check represent a number of different phonemes. When decoding a real word in the check, the pupil has to select the correct phoneme for the word, for example the 'ow' in 'blow' should not be pronounced as the 'ow' in 'cow'. However, when decoding a pseudo-word, all plausible alternative pronunciations are acceptable.

The tables on the next page provide guidance to teachers scoring the check on acceptable pronunciations of the pseudo-words in the check.

### Regional pronunciations

Some of the pseudo-words in the screening check contain vowel digraphs that end with 'r', such as 'ur'. In a small number of regional dialects, the 'r' in words with these vowel digraphs is voiced and pupils who speak with these dialects will be known to their teachers. For these pupils, pseudo-words with a vowel digraph ending in 'r', such as 'murbs', may be pronounced as /mɜ:ɹbs/ instead of /mɜ:bs/. These pronunciations are acceptable alternatives in the relevant pseudo-words.

Pseudo-word	Acceptable pronunciations	Phonemic representation
<b>dat</b>	This item uses the 'd' from 'dig' and rhymes with 'sat'.	/dæt/
<b>cag</b>	This item uses the 'c' from 'cot' and rhymes with 'sag'.	/kæg/
<b>rin</b>	This item uses the 'r' from 'rod' and rhymes with 'tin'.	/rɪn/
<b>ept</b>	This item combines the 'e' from 'ebb' and the 'pt' from 'apt'.	/ept/
<b>jash</b>	This item uses the 'j' from 'just' and rhymes with 'dash'.	/dʒæʃ/
<b>quib</b>	This item uses the 'qu' from 'quit' and rhymes with 'glib'.	/kwɪb/
<b>coid</b>	This item uses the 'c' from 'cart' and rhymes with 'void'.	/kɔɪd/
<b>quass</b>	This item uses the 'qu' from 'quick' and rhymes with 'mass'. All regional pronunciations of the 'a' are acceptable.	/kwæs/
<b>glog</b>	This item uses the 'gl' from 'glue' and rhymes with 'frog'.	/glɒg/
<b>blard</b>	This item uses the 'bl' from 'bloom' and rhymes with 'guard'.	/blɑ:d/ or /blɑ:rd/
<b>disp</b>	This item uses the 'd' from 'defy' and rhymes with 'lisp'.	/dɪsp/
<b>murbs</b>	This item uses the 'm' from 'marks' and rhymes with 'curbs'.	/mɜ:bs/ or /mɜ:rbz/

Pseudo-word	Acceptable pronunciations	Phonemic representation
<b>tay</b>	This item uses the 't' from 'tie' and rhymes with 'pay'.	/teɪ/
<b>sloam</b>	This item uses the 'sl' from 'slime' and rhymes with 'roam'.	/sləʊm/
<b>zued</b>	This item uses the 'z' from 'zoom' and rhymes with 'cued'.	/zu:d/
<b>meve</b>	This item uses the 'm' from 'more' and rhymes with 'Steve'.	/mi:v/
<b>clend</b>	This item uses the 'cl' from 'clamp' and rhymes with 'spend'.	/klænd/
<b>braits</b>	This item uses the 'br' from 'brick' and rhymes with 'straits'.	/breɪts/
<b>scrug</b>	This item uses the 'scr' from 'scrap' and rhymes with 'plug'.	/scrʌg/
<b>splue</b>	This item uses the 'spl' from 'split' and rhymes with 'glue'.	/splu:/
